Ted Alexander is the founder and host of Chambersburg Civil War Seminars. He is a popular author, tour guide and lecturer.

Bevin Alexander is the author of ten books on military history, including *How Wars Are Won, How America Got It Right*, and his latest book, *How the South Could Have Won the Civil War. His Lost Victories: The Military Genius of Stonewall Jackson* was chosen by the Civil War Book Review as one of the seventeen books that have most transformed Civil War scholarship.

Paul C. Anderson is a history professor at Clemson University and the author of *Blood Image: Turner Ashby in the Civil War and the Southern Mind*.

Ed Bearss is America's premier battlefield tour guide. He has been with our seminars since they began in 1989.

Art Bergeron is a Louisiana native currently serving as Reference Historian with the United States Army Military History Institute at Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania. Art was the Historian at Pamplin Historical Park & The National Museum of the Civil War Soldier near Petersburg, Virginia, from 1996 to 2003. Bergeron was Chief of Interpretive Services for the Louisiana Office of State Parks from 1987-1996. He is the author of a dozen books on the Civil War, including *Guide to Louisiana Confederate Military Units 1861 -1865*. He is a combat veteran of Vietnam.

Peter Cozzens is one of the nation's leading military historians. He is the author of sixteen critically acclaimed books on the American Civil War and the Indian Wars of the American West. All of Cozzens' books have been selections of the Book of the Month Club, History Book Club, and/or the Military Book Club. Cozzens' *This Terrible Sound: The Battle of Chickamauga* and *The Shipwreck of Their Hopes: The Battles for Chattanooga* were both Main Selections of the History Book Club and were chosen by *Civil War Magazine* as two of the 100 greatest works ever written on the conflict. His latest book *Shenandoah 1862: Stonewall Jackson's Valley Campaign* is now in its fourth printing.

Pat Falci is an actor, lecturer and historian. He has served as historical consultant for the movies "Gettysburg" and "Gods and Generals," as well as several documentaries.

Steve French is a high school history teacher and an authority on the Civil War in the Lower Shenandoah Valley. He is the author of a number of books and articles. His latest book is a study on Imboden's Brigade in the Gettysburg Campaign.

Jerry Holsworth is a former history teacher and National Park Service ranger. He is the author of numerous articles on the Civil War and is currently writing a book on Hood's Texas Brigade.

John Hoptak is a Park Ranger at Antietam National Battlefield and the author of several books and articles on the Civil War.

Stephen Lang is an award winning actor who has played numerous historical characters in movies. Among them: General George Pickett in "Gettysburg" and "Stonewall" Jackson in "Gods and Generals". He has been a guest speaker at one of our seminars a few years ago and plans to attend schedule permitting.

Steve Longenecker is Professor of History at Bridgewater College. He is the author of *Shenandoah Religion: Outsiders and the Mainstream, 1716-1865*, and his current project is a religious history of antebellum and Civil War Gettysburg, Pa.

Jonathan Noyalas is a history professor at Lord Fairfax Community College in Middletown, VA, where he also serves as the Director of the College's Institute of Culture and History and the Center for Civil War History. He is the author of *Plagued by War: Winchester, Virginia, During the Civil War* and *My Will is Absolute Law: A Biography of Union General Robert H. Milroy*. He was the editor and contributing author for the Shenandoah Valley Battlefields Foundation's *If this Valley is Lost, Virginia is Lost: Stonewall Jackson's Valley Campaign*.

Nicholas P. Picerno is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Shenandoah Valley Battlefields Foundation, where he chairs the committee on Interpretation and Education. He has lectured at several universities and colleges, historical societies, Civil War roundtables, and symposiums on a variety of topics related to Civil War history. He has contributed to several books on the subject, including the "Time-Life" Civil War series.

George Rabbai is a music professor and professional jazz trumpet player. He has backed up notables such as Rosemary Clooney and has performed with the Woody Herman band. His program on Civil War bugle calls is always well received at our seminars.

John Schildt is the author of more than 20 books on various aspects of the Civil War. Among them *Jackson and the Preachers*.

Tim Snyder is a leading authority on the C&O Canal during the Civil War. He is currently writing a book on this topic.

Jeffry Wert is one of our most popular speakers. He has been nominated for the Pulitzer Prize and has authored eight books on the Civil War, including a study of the Stonewall Brigade.

Joseph Whitehorne is a history professor at Lord Fairfax College in Virginia. He is an authority on various aspects of U.S. military history, including the Civil War. He is the author of a number of books about the Civil War in the Shenandoah Valley.

Daniel Carrol Toomey is one of the foremost authorities on Maryland in the Civil War. He is the author of more than six books on the subject.

Sites visited include –

UNGER'S STORE - January 1, 1862, Jackson's army spent its second night here.
BATH - On January 4, 1862, Jackson attacked the Union garrison at Bath.
HANCOCK - Jackson shelled Hancock from the south bank of the Potomac River between January 4 and January 7, 1862.
BLOOMERY GAP - After leaving the vicinity of Hancock on January 1, 1862, Jackson and his command camped here on the way to Romney.
HANGING ROCK - While Jackson was retreating from Hancock on January 7, 1862, a Union force of about 2,000 men surprised the Confederate militia force of 700 men and a section of artillery here.
ROMNEY - After the Union garrison evacuated Romney on January 10, 1862, Jackson occupied the town on January 14.
